EDTAC SUPPORTS WAWA HOUSING PLEDGE

Since the formation of the Wawa Economic Development and Tourism Advisory Committee of Council (EDTAC) in 2022, the dedicated volunteer members have been busy forwarding recommendations to staff and Council on ways to prepare Wawa investment and programs existing support businesses entrepreneurs.

Current EDTAC members include Chair Heidi McLaren, Vice-Chair Anya Switzer, Mayor Melanie Pilon, David Wells, Kadean Ogilvie, Johanna and Angela Calaiezzi.



EDTAC was formed to provide advice to the Municipality on ways to support economic, business and tourism opportunities in Wawa and the surrounding region. Since its formation, the Committee has been busy providing input into several projects such as the Wawa Five Year Tourism Plan, Tourism Round Table Dinners and the Wawa Downtown Community Improvement Plan (CIP) which is currently in development.

Recently, the Committee assisted to develop a Wawa Housing Plan that included a number of recommendations on how the Municipality could assist in supporting the community to build more housing. EDTAC has also recently supported a Municipal Housing Pledge which sets targets and ways to support the building of new homes in Wawa every year, up until 2031, following the pledges passed by larger urban centres in Ontario, which were mandated by the Provincial Government in 2022.



COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PLAN UPDATE

The update of the Community Improvement Plan (CIP) was highlighted as an action item in the Wawa Strategic Plan (2023-2026). A CIP encourages revitalization initiatives and stimulates development/redevelopment. The Plan would allow the municipality to provide tax assistance, grants or loans to assist in the revitalization of lands and/or buildings. A downtown tour and visioning workshop took place on October 24, 2023 where WSP Inc., staff and members of the community worked to highlight areas and opportunities with particular relevance to the CIP process. Information gathered will be included in the CIP Background and Directions Report. A public open house will take place in January 2024, and all community members are invited to learn about the CIP process and provide your feedback. WAWA WATER & WASTEWATER PLAN

The Municipality of Wawa has prepared a Water and Wastewater Master Plan (WWMP) to ensure that its current and future water and wastewater infrastructure needs are met. The Municipality has completed this project through the Schedule B process in the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment 2023. A project file report documenting the planning process undertaken, details of the study recommendations, potential impacts, and mitigation measures were completed and is now available for public review.
