Sand River Part 5 of 9

Portage 10 avoids boulder rapids and fast water. The first 340 m can be run by competent canoeists but in periods of low water use the portage, or line your canoe. The next 320 m can be lined. If running the fast water, watch out for a large rock in the middle of the lower end of this stretch of fast water. Between portages 10 and 11 watch for submerged rocks.

Portage 11 and 12 go around small waterfalls

The portage to Carol Lake leaves from the north end of the campsite at the start of portage 12. Although not maintained, this 1200 m portage is occasionally used by anglers to provide access to good brook trout fishing in Carol Lake.

Portage to Wildcat Lake – this 660 m portage leaves the river bank just above portage 13 connecting the Sand River Route to the Old Woman Lake – Gamitagama Lake Route (see Old Woman Lake to Sand River and Gamitagama Lake to Old Woman Lake).

Portage 17 – Calvin Falls is only one of two significant drops in the Sand River. This is a rough and rocky portage.



