



Lake Superior

Crescent Lake

This easy route introduces canoeists to lake travel and portaging. Fishing for brook trout, lake trout and splake is good. MacGregor Lake is the only lake trout lake in the southern end of the park. Kenny Lake is spring fed and so clear that the brook trout are easily spooked – try fishing later in the evening.

Access: Crescent Lake Campground or Kenny Lake at Highway 17

To: Loop canoe route via Crescent, MacGregor, Kenny, and Mudhole Lakes

Length: 3 km return;
4 portages (60 m to 350 m)

Time: 4 hours


Portages:
Most of the portages cross the Crescent Lake Hiking Trail. The portage from Crescent Lake to MacGregor follows the trail for the last 200 metres.
