Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with an overview of the Infrastructure Services work completed during the month of May 2023.

Operations

- Roads and sidewalk sweeping were performed
- Benches and garbage cans were placed along Broadway and Mission Road
- The Cemetery was opened and the grounds serviced for the starting season
- Regular maintenance of gravel roads and ditching was started
- Summer student was hired and began lawn care and town clean up.

Capital Projects

- Intake Project – a contractor was hired to complete a ROV inspection of the water intake at the low lift station and also an inspection of the water tower in the Mission.
- Landfill Expansion - roll off bins were Procured and purchased with a delivery date in June. A truck was purchased to move the bins and will be available in June for pick up .Kresin Engineering surveyed the site for final contours of waste giving the Municipality an estimated amount of fill area.
- Cemetery - still waiting for Tulloch Engineering to come back their scope of work for the site expansion.
- Mini-excavator and trailer - an RFQ was put out for a 5 to 6 ton mini excavator and comparable trailer. The request was well attended with 10 companies submitting quotes.

Airport

- Summer student was hired and trained on all aspects of daily routines including runway reports, fuelling aircrafts and daily/weekly procedures.
- Monday to Thursday is still a busy schedule with 2 -3 planes a day bringing miners to work at various sites.

Landfill

- Weather has changed bringing residents to the site to drop off the accumulated treasures from past years.
- Kresin Engineering staked out the new landfill expansion first cell and Infrastructure used Municipal equipment to begin digging the cell so that it can be used in the latter part of June.

Water and Sewer

- Spring flushing was done to all hydrants and a list was made as to which 16 hydrants were to be rehabilitated when the contractors show up in June.
- An unexpected power outage identified some technical issues with battery back ups for the water plant, low lift and the SCADA system. The problems were temporarily fixed with parts ordered to be replaced as soon as they come in.

Month Ahead

Forecasted for June:

- Rehabilitate 16 older identified hydrants
- Maintenance and Calcium gravel roads
- Finish street sweeping
- Line painting and markings
- Start sidewalk repairs
- Grass cutting town boulevards and cemeteries
- Hold an information session about “Community Safety Zones” around the schools which looks for resident feedback.
